Dear Mr Smith,

I am deeply concerned that the ANZ Bank continues to provide finance to companies that manufacture cluster munitions, most recently to US arms manufacturer L3 - Communications. I note that cluster munitions have created humanitarian problems in every conflict they have been used in and have killed and maimed thousands of civilians, most after the conflict has ended.

I note that the ANZ Bank has said it will not provide finance to directly fund the production of cluster munitions and landmines, but it provides finance to companies involved in these activities.

Funding one part of the company still frees up funds to be used in the production of such weapons. This is not good enough. I call on the ANZ to join with those banks globally that have committed to not doing business with companies that manufacture cluster munitions and landmines.
